Puck has struggled to receive gender-affirming care


Relocates Semi-Often

What did we ask?


- Can you tell me a bit about your experiences with the healthcare system?

- What healthcare/health tracker apps do you use? Have they been LGBTQ inclusive? Generally, what role does technology play in your health?














Puck (they/he), 19


Key Takeaways

Impact Varies!

Some interviewees felt like their Queerness never really impacted their quality of/access to healthcare, while for others it was a recurring source of stress and emotional strain.

Social Media: Gamechanger

Having sites like Reddit, Instagram, Discord, etc., have helped Queer people find inclusive healthcare providers through their communities.



App Inclusivity

Queer users look for menstruation tracker apps that don't just offer insights and pregnancy tracking for heterosexual women (like Clue)!

Gender Identity

Our cisgender and cis-presenting interviewees didn't experience as much discrimination as Puck did.
