

Has a patient experiencing organ rejection from an indigenous community speaking Mixteco-bajo without translators. She doesn't feel that she's doing right without knowing what to do

Physicians frequently answer same email questions which takes up a lot of time.

> It took 45 mins to setup the interpreter online, no interpreter available at nights/weekends, hard to find indigenous dialect interpreters

Wealthier diabetes patients had access to apps, monitors and pumps. Low-income kids don't have access to attend chronic disease camps and glucose monitor pumps





INSIGHTS

The best expert is someone who just experienced similar childcare stage a week ago.
Sometimes someone who understands is more important than expert credentials'advice.

People often experience choice paralysis or anxiety about making the "best" decision regarding their child. First time parents can very easily forget the details of the struggles they underwent after time has passed, meaning they often fail to offer enough empathy or relevant advice to people in their shoes. Trustworthiness for caregivers/ specialists comes from credentials and getting connected face-to-face which was difficult through Cleo app which was through a video call.

Everyone's background and experiences are different and shape their needs.






Resources are hard to navigate
