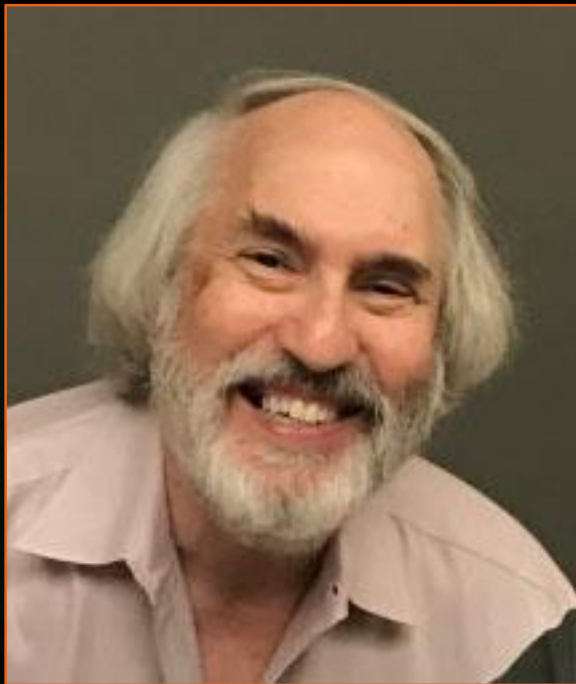

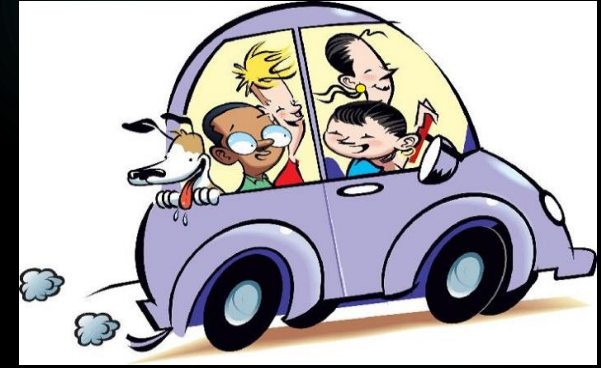

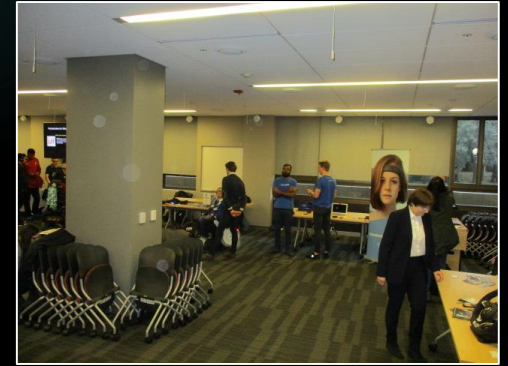

- ▶ **Goal: short, concise, well-written, and highly readable report with few grammatical and spelling errors.**
- ▶ Mid-term report - 10 to 15 pages of narrative - text and images
- ▶ Suggested format different for fabrication vs non-fabrication projects

- ▶ Report Writing Tips documents **suggested** report features

Mid-term Evaluation Comments



- ▶ Good comments, bad comments, how to evaluate?
- ▶ Conflicting comments on content, presentation, or process
- ▶ There may be just one comment on an issue, either positive or negative
- ▶ Everyone has a different perspective, opinion, and level of understanding
- ▶ Not everyone is “right” due to emphasis, misunderstandings, bias, and subjectivity
- ▶ Some evaluators may pick up on a specific detail, not on your major point, so emphasize major points on a separate slide
- ▶ **Make you own honest judgment on comments that could be helpful**
- ▶ Same goes for your mid-term report markup
- ▶ What do the scores mean with respect to your grade?
