A sample email newsletter is set up for you on the CS 21 exercises site:

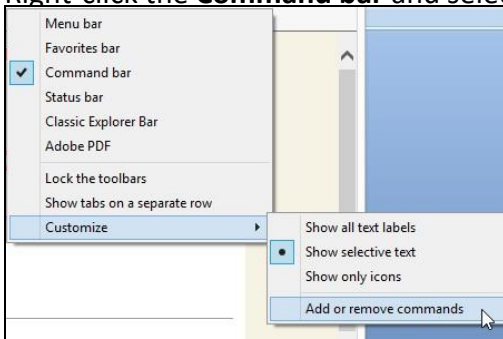

To send an email newsletter:

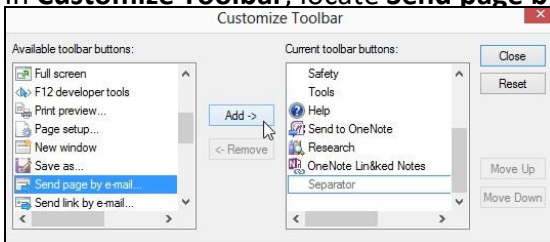
- Mac Users
  1. Open the email newsletter in *Safari* (use **File > Open File** if it's on your computer)
  2. On the **File** menu, select **Mail Contents of This Page** (Safari 5 and earlier) or **File > Share > Email this Page** (Safari 6 and newer)
  3. *Apple Mail* should open with the email newsletter in the body of the message. Enter the email headers (to, subject, cc, bcc, etc.), and send!
- Windows Users
  1. Open the email newsletter in *Internet Explorer* (use CTRL-O to locate it if it's on your computer).
  2. Right-click the window and select **Command Bar**.



3. Right-click the **Command bar** and select **Add or remove commands**.



4. In **Customize Toolbar**, locate **Send page by e-mail**, then click **Add**, and then click **Close**.



5. Click **Send page by e-mail**.
6. *Outlook* should open with the email newsletter in the body of the message. Enter the email headers (to, subject, cc, bcc, etc.), and send!
