Simple Frames Demo/Take-home Exercise

- 1. Open Internet Explorer and visit http://www.stanford.edu/group/csp/cs21/exercises.html
- 2. Under **Week 9**, click the link **<u>Simple Frame</u>**.
- 3. Under File, choose Save As.
- 4. In the **Save In** field, choose a folder on your computer (click the **Create New Folder** icon if you want to create a new folder into which to place these files).
- 5. In the Save As Type field, choose Web Page Complete.
- 6. Click Save.

Using Notepad, open the various .htm files to see and change the source codes.

- Simple Frame.htm → the frameset file
- f1.htm, f2.htm, f3.htm \rightarrow the frames

Some suggestions to change:

- Change Simple Frame.htm to have different frameset information:
 <frameset rows="30%,50,*"> or <frameset rows="40,15%,*">
- Change f1.htm, f2.htm, and f3.htm to reflect the changes in Simple Frame.htm (e.g., when you change it to 30%, 50, * change f1.html to say "This frame is 30% high")

- contact.htm, faq.htm, home.htm, new.htm, nf1.htm, nf2.htm \rightarrow the frames

Some suggestions to change:

- Change the attribute target="rightframe" to target="_blank" on the links of nf2.htm
- Change the attribute target="rightframe" to target="_self" on the links of nf2.htm
- Change the attribute target="rightframe" to target="_top" on the links of nf2.htm
- Remove the attribute target="rightframe" completely on the links of nf2.htm
