STUDY DESCRIPTION

Data for 2,053 individuals between 19 and 65 years of age living in cities with a population between 30,000 and 280,000, and in households which had at least one adult employed in a non-farming occupation. The 112 variables are of two general types. One group concerns socio-demographic background characteristics while the second set deals with time use for a 24-hour period. The 1965-1966 time use data were obtained from a diary of activities kept by the respondent over a 24-hour period and the 1975-1976 data were collected in a face-to-face interview. In both cases the socio-demographic data were gathered from interviews. The file contains common variables for respondents from two separate surveys: 1,241 residents from Americans' Use of Time, 1965-1966 (ICPSR 7254), and 812 respondents from Time Use in Economic and Social Accounts, 1975-1976 (ICPSR 7580). Due to changes in coding and editing procedures from 1965 to 1975 some detail in time use activity codes was lost and activity codes could not be made exactly comparable in all cases.

THE 1965-1975 TIME USE FILE IS CONSTRUCTED FROM THE UNITED STATES SAMPLE OF THE 1965 MULTI-NATIONAL TIME USE STUDY AND THE 1975-76 STUDY OF AMERICANS' USE OF TIME BY THE ECONOMIC BEHAVIOR PROGRAM AT THE INSTITUTE FOR SOCIAL RESEARCH. THE FILE IS AN OSIPIS TYPE 1 RECTANGULAR DICTIONARY-DATA FILE CONTAINING DEMOGRAPHIC INFORMATION AND NUMBER OF MINUTES SPENT IN 6X VARIOUS ACTIVITIES. DUE TO CHANGES IN CODING AND EDITING PROCEDURES FROM 1965 TO 1975, SOME OF THE DETAIL IN THE ACTIVITY CODES WAS LOST AND ACTIVITY CATEGORIES COULD NOT BE MADE EXACTLY COMPARABLE IN ALL CASES. EXISTING DIFFERENCES ARE DOCUMENTED IN THE CODEBOOK THAT FOLLOWS.

SAMPLES FOR THE 1965 AND 1975 STUDIES WERE DRAWN ON DIFFERENT BASES; IN THE CREATION OF THE FILE, THE 1975 SAMPLE WAS RESTRICTED TO MATCH THE DESIGN OF THE 1965 SAMPLE.

#<01965 SAMPLE

THE 1965 UNITED STATES SAMPLE WAS DRAWN FROM HOUSEHOLDS IN CITIES WITH POPULATIONS OF 30,000-280,000, WHICH HAD AT LEAST ONE EMPLOYED ADULT IN NON-FARMING OCCUPATIONS. ELIGIBLE RESPONDENTS WERE BETWEEN 19 AND 65 YEARS OF AGE. THE SAMPLE OF 1241 RESPONDENTS CONFORMED TO THE SPECIFICATIONS OF THE MULTI-NATIONAL STUDY OF WHICH IT WAS A PART.

#<01975 SAMPLE

THE 1975 TIME USE STUDY SAMPLE HAD NONE OF THE RESTRICTIONS IMPOSED ON THE 1965 SAMPLE. A REPRESENTATIVE SAMPLE OF U.S. HOUSEHOLDS WAS DRAWN, AND WITHIN EACH HOUSEHOLD ADULTS AGED 18 YEARS OR OVER WERE ELIGIBLE. A RANDOM SELECTION PROCESS DETERMINED THE RESPONDENT FROM THOSE ELIGIBLE

IN ORDER TO MAKE THE TWO SAMPLES COMPARABLE, A SUBSET OF THE 1975 SAMPLE WAS DEFINED WHICH EXCLUDED RESPONDENTS 19 YEARS OLD, OVER 65 YEARS OLD, UNEMPLOYED RESPONDENTS WHOSE SPOUSES WERE ALSO UNEMPLOYED, RESPONDENTS WHO WERE THEMSELVES FARMERS OR WHOSE SPOUSES WERE FARMERS, AND RESPONDENTS LIVING IN AREAS NOT COMPARABLE TO THE 1965 URBAN SAMPLING AREAS. OF THE 1519 ORIGINAL RESPONDENTS, 812 REMAINED IN THE SAMPLE AFTER THE EXCLUSIONS WERE MADE, MAKING THE TOTAL SAMPLE OF THE DATA FILE 2353 RESPONDENTS.

#<0TIME DIARY DATA:

TIME DIARY DATA, IN WHICH RESPONDENTS REPORTED THEIR ACTIVITIES FOR A 24 HOUR DAY, WAS COLLECTED BETWEEN NOVEMBER 1 AND DECEMBER 15, 1965; THE DAY OF THE WEEK TO BE REPORTED ABOUT WAS RANDOMLY ASSIGNED.

THE TIME DIARY DATA FROM THE 1975 STUDY IS FROM THE FIRST WAVE OF DATA COLLECTION WHICH TOOK PLACE BETWEEN OCTOBER 17 AND NOVEMBER 17, 1975. THE DAY REPORTED

ABOUT WAS THE DAY PREVIOUS TO THE INTERVIEW, AND
WELL AS THE INTERVIEWER MADE CONTACT WITH THE RES-
PONDENTS. THE DIARY DATA COLLECTION PROCEDURES
DIFFERED IN THAT IN THE EARLIER STUDY, RESPONDENTS
WERE GIVEN A DIARY FORM TO KEEP AND THEN WERE
INTERVIEWED AFTER THE DIARY DAY TO BE SURE THE FORM
WAS COMPLETE AND CORRECT; IN THE 1975 STUDY, THE DATA
WAS COLLECTED IN A FACE-TO-FACE INTERVIEW ONLY.
